

Four retire with 143 total years of service

ARG recognized four more retirements during the second half of our 2021 fiscal year.

Ed Jay and Steve Woods both started work at the Bradford refinery July 5, 1978; moved to Operator I in Blending and Packaging on May 19, 1979; and to Operator II in August 1979.

Ed was an operator at the Platformer briefly in early 1981 before heading to Foster Brook, where he worked at the FB Boiler Plant, FB Blending, Tank Farm and Crude Unloading. In 2002 Ed undertook learning the Energy Tech role, moving from trainee to Energy Tech I on March 3, 2003. He was promoted to Tech II on Oct. 27, 2003, and named Lead Energy Tech on June 17, 2016. Ed retired from this role

May 14, 2021.

Steve, meanwhile, worked his way up to Operator II at the Barrel House by February 1985. He worked just more than two years with the Electric Shop before returning to the Barrel House as Operator II, the role from which he retired Sept. 7.

Charles Marshall joined ARG on Oct. 1, 2008, when ARG acquired Clinton Petroleum Co. He hauled crude oil to our Sandyville terminal for 13 years, until his retirement July 30.


